Welcome to the 2020/2021 Nunatta Sunakkutaangit Society Annual General Meeting!

The Nunatta Sunakkutaangit Museum was incorporated as a non-profit society in 1969 to document and care for the growing collection of Inuit artwork and cultural materials from across the Eastern Arctic. Over the past half-century, the organizations mission and direction has changed, but Inuit culture, history, and community have remained core components of its identity. This Nunavut non-profit society has been operating for 50 years, and is here today because of the ongoing efforts of several generations of dedicated community members. Over five decades of volunteer support and community engagement has made the NSM a cornerstone of Iqaluit's culture, tourism, and arts scene.

To say that 2020 was a challenging year is a massive understatement, but the NSM has worked diligently to remain flexible and responsive in the face of uncertainty and to find ways to continue to deliver community programming and engagement in safe and healthy ways in full compliance of the Government of Nunavut's public health regulations and recommendations.

Some of the ways that the NSM has adapted to the shifting realities brought by the COVID pandemic has been to set policies in place to ensure the health and safety of both NSM staff and visitors such as visits by appointment, limits on the number of visitors at one time, contact tracing, mask wearing, and increased efforts to ensure



surfaces are decontaminated. In addition, the NSM has increased focus online through social media outreach. As the situation continues to evolve, so will the NSM's policies.

Though the NSM was unable to benefit from cruise ship traffic and sales this summer, the reduced visitor traffic has given the NSM staff a rare opportunity to focus on taking inventory of the NSM's collection and internal organization. **Thank you to our staff!**
